


# **Participation in UN meetings**

NGOs wishing to attend UN meetings must first complete their annual accreditation with UNOG. The <u>procedure</u> is detailed on the <u>UNOG website</u>. Specific registrations for events such as the upcoming Human Rights Council session have to be made online through the <u>Indico</u> platform. Registrations are not managed by UNOG but by the meeting organizer.

### **UN General Assembly**

World leaders will gather in New York in September to engage in the <u>high-level General Debate</u> under the theme, "Rebuilding trust and reigniting global solidarity: Accelerating action on the 2030 Agenda and its Sustainable Development Goals towards peace, prosperity, progress and sustainability for all." Watch the meetings live on <u>UN Web TV</u> or on the <u>General Debate website</u>.

As per standing practice, access to the UN Headquarters during the 78<sup>th</sup> session of the UN General Assembly will be restricted. A limited number of special passes will be distributed daily from 18 to 26 September by the DESA NGO Branch, on a first-come, first-served basis for participation on the same day. #### **SDG Summit**


The 2023 SDG Summit will take place on 18-19 September. Convened by the President of the General Assembly, the Summit will mark the half-way point to the deadline set for achieving the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs. It will respond to the impact of multiple and interlocking crises facing the world and is expected to reignite a sense of hope, optimism, and enthusiasm for the 2030 Agenda. Major Groups and other stakeholders were invited to submit written feedback.

To generate additional opportunities for the engagement of all stakeholders ahead of the SDG Summit – civil society, the private sector, youth, women, etc. – the UN is hosting an <u>SDG Action Weekend</u> on 16 - 17 September. It includes the SDG Mobilization Day (16 September) for stakeholder engagement toward an ambitious SDG Summit, and the SDG Acceleration Day (17 September) focusing on UN High-Impact Initiatives at UN.

The <u>ActNow Campaign</u> was launched to inspire people to act for the SDGs. The challenge will run for 4 weeks and begins on 21 August and ends on 17 September. Here is the schedule for the upcoming weeks: week 2 (28 Aug-3 Sept): <u>Actions for a world working together</u>; week 3 (4-10 Sept): <u>Actions for a better economy</u>; week 4 (11-17 Sept): <u>Actions for a just society</u>.

#### International Youth Conference (#IYC8)

The 8<sup>th</sup> edition of the <u>International Youth Conference</u> will take place from 21 to 24 September. It will provide a platform for young people to discuss the progress made towards achieving the SDGs by 2030 and explore ways young people can contribute to this effort. The conference will be open to youth leaders, activists, students, and representatives from youth-focused NGOs from all around the word and the selection process will prioritize applicants from marginalized and underrepresented groups to ensure diversity and inclusion.

# High-Level Meetings hosted by the President of the General Assembly

- On 20 September, the President of the General Assembly will host a <u>high-level meeting on</u>
   <u>Pandemic Prevention, Preparedness and Response</u> under the overall theme "Making the
   world safer: Creating and maintaining political momentum and solidarity for Pandemic
   Prevention, Preparedness and Response".
- On 21 September, the President of the General Assembly will host a one-day <u>high-level</u> <u>meeting on Universal Health Coverage</u> under the overall theme "Universal health coverage: expanding our ambition for health and well-being in a post-COVID world".
- On 22 September, a <u>second high-level meeting on the Fight against Tuberculosis</u> will take place under the theme will be "Advancing science, finance and innovation, and their benefits, to urgently end the global tuberculosis epidemic, in particular, by ensuring equitable access to prevention, testing, treatment and care."

### **Human Rights 75**

In 2023, we commemorate the <u>75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights</u>, which coincides with the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights. OHCHR has been sharing information, especially with youth organizations and young people on the present and future of human rights for the development of the <u>Human Rights 75 Youth Declaration</u>.


OHCHR is organizing a **High-Level Event on "Civic Space: Enhancing Participation through Strengthened Partnerships"** as part of a series of roundtables to mark the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The event will showcase the important contribution of civil society in shaping the solutions needed for a more effective and responsive UN, while also highlighting the challenges faced by civil society to participate effectively in UN processes. The event will be held in UNHQ on 13 September, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. in Conference Room 5 (please <u>register here</u> by C.O.B. 7 September) and can also be watched live on <u>UN Web TV.</u>

# **Human Rights Council**

The Human Rights Council 54<sup>th</sup> regular session will take place from 11 September to 13 October. For more information regarding NGO participation, click <u>here</u>. Furthermore, resolutions, decisions and President's statements, as well as the draft Programme are available <u>online</u>.

On 28 or 29 September, the Assistant Secretary-General for Human Rights will present the Secretary-General's report on the "Cooperation with the United Nations, its representatives and mechanisms in the field of human rights - Report of the Secretary-General" (A/HRC/54/61). Known as an annual report on acts of reprisal and intimidation, it compiles and analyses any available information, from all appropriate sources, on alleged reprisals for cooperation with the UN in the field of human rights, as well as recommendations.

# Committee on the Rights of the Child

The 94<sup>th</sup> session of the Committee on the Rights of the Child will take place from 4 to 22 September and will consider the following States: Albania, Dominican Republic, Andorra, Liechtenstein, Kyrgyzstan, and Togo. ### Pre- and Post- SDG Summit events

To mark the half-way point to the deadline set for achieving the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs, the President of the General Assembly will convene the <u>SDG Summit 2023</u> in New York. On this important occasion, the SDG Lab and its partners are organizing two related events, a pre- and post- Summit event on 14 and 28 September, respectively. These two events (1st one virtual, 2nd one in-person at the Geneva Graduate Institute) are intended to provide Geneva actors an opportunity to share perspectives on the Summit and broader SDG implementation successes and challenges.
